#### **MY 4-H STORY OUTLINE**

I started reading feed labels to better understand why we feed something. I also talked to my veterinarian and asked questions about health and digestion. I learned that cows are ruminates, which means they have a 4-compartment stomach and their digestive needs are different than mine. I spent more time walking my heifer, although it was also easier to walk her already, than last year's, I still put more time into it and it really paid off! Next year I want to get a heifer out of the same cow and bull and hopefully she will be as awesome as this heifer is. I also started looking up research and talked to my county extension agent about careers with animals. I think this is something I might want to do in my future. Not sure if I want to be a veterinarian, but my county agent helped me learn about other careers in the industry.
